Document Analysis

- What does the source tell us? (Consider the 5 W's)
 - What is the event or action being depicted?
 - o What people are described or shown?
 - o Why is it happening?
 - Where do the events take place?
 - When is it happening? What clues lead you to this conclusion?
- What kind of document is it?
 - What type of medium is the source? (letter, diary, newspaper, photograph etc.)
 - What type of source is it? (primary or secondary)
 - o Is it public or private?
- Why was it written?
 - O Who wrote/created it?
 - o Was it prepared for a specific audience?
 - O What is the author's background?
- What is the message?
 - O What is obvious?
 - What is implicit (read between the lines)?
- Is bias present?
 - o Is there any reason to suspect bias?
 - o Is the vocabulary "slanted"?
 - Are opinions presented as facts?
 - Are there any false statements?
 - o Are there any omissions?
 - o Is or was there an agenda/aim/purpose?
 - o Would the intended audience have perceived bias?
- Is the document authentic (ie genuine)?
 - o Can names, events, dates, be verified?
 - o Is the language appropriate to the time?
 - o Are materials (paper, ink etc.) genuine?
 - Is it consistent with other information?
- What other questions does it raise?
