### **SAMPLE BIBLIOGRAPHIC ENTRIES**

## CHICAGO STYLE

PE OF SOURCE	FORMAT AND EXAMPLE
Book with one author	Format: Author's last name, Author's first name. <i>Title of book</i> . City of publication: Publisher, year of publication.
	Note: When there are two or more authors, <b>only</b> the name of the first author is inverted (flipped).
	<b>Example:</b> Stewart, J.D.M. Being Prime Minister. Toronto: Dundurn Press, 2018.
Specific ar-	Format:
ticle or page from website with author given	Author's last name, Author's first name. "Name of specific page or article."  Name of website. Name of organization associated with the site, date site was published or last modified. URL.
	Notes:
	>> If the name of the website and the organization associated with the website are the same, simply write that title only.
	If there is no date of publication or update, write the date you accessed (looked at) the website instead.
	» If there is no specific date (i.e., month and day), just write the year.
	Example:
	Hacker, Carlotta. "Emily Stowe." In <i>The Canadian Encyclopedia</i> . Historica Canada, March 4 2015, https://www.thecanadianencyclopedia.ca/en/article/emily-stowe.
Journal article	Format:
in online database	Author's last name, Author's first name. "Name of article." Name of journal volume number, issue number (publication year): pages.
	Example:
	Moniz, Tracy. "A Woman's Place Is in the News." <i>Journalism History</i> 42, no. 2 (Summer 2016): 81-90. https://search.ebscohost.com/login.aspx?direct=true&db=af-h&AN=116882823&site=ehost-live.

## MLA STYLE

Format: Author's last name, Author's first name. Title of book. Publisher, year of publication.  Note: When there are two or more authors, only the name of the first author is inverted
(flipped). <b>Example:</b> Stewart, J.D.M. Being Prime Minister. Dundurn Press, 2018.
Format: Author's last name, Author's first name. "Name of specific page or article." Name of site, Name of organization associated with the site, Date site was published or last modified, URL.  Notes:  If there is no date of publication or update, write the date you accessed (looked at) the website after the URL instead.  If there is no specific date (i.e., month and day), just write the year.  Example: Hacker, Carlotta. "Emily Stowe." The Canadian Encyclopedia, Historica Canada, March 4, 2015, https://www.thecanadianencyclopedia.ca/en/article/emily-stowe.
Format: Author's last name, Author's first name. "Name of article." Name of journal, volume number, issue number, publication date, pages. Name of database, URL. Date accessed.  Example: Moniz, Tracy. "A Woman's Place is in the News." Journalism History, vol. 42, no. 2, Summer 2016,

#### APA STYLE

TYPE OF SOURCE	FORMAT AND EXAMPLE
Book with one author	Format:  Author's last name, Author's first initial. (Year of publication). <i>Title of book</i> . Publisher.  Example: Stewart, J.D.M. (2018). <i>Being Prime Minister</i> . Dundurn Press.
Specific ar- ticle or page from website with author given	Format: Author's last name, Author's first initial. (Date site was published or last updated). Name of specific page or article. Name of website. Retrieved date, from URL.  Example: Hacker, C. (2015, March 4). Emily Stowe. The Canadian Encyclopedia. Retrieved May 10, 2019, from https://www.thecanadianencyclopedia.ca/en/article/emily-stowe.
Journal article in online database	Format: Author's last name, Author's first initial. (Year of publication). Name of article. Name of journal, volume(issue), pages. DOI (digital object identifier).  Example: Moniz, Tracy. (2016). A Woman's Place is in the News.
